- 565 Canadian OL Survey respondents
- **251** Nanos Poll respondents

- Insufficient, short-term, and competitive funding
- Disconnection from the regions' waters
- Access to the water and its resources
- Language constraints

# **Preliminary Recommendations**



### **Preliminary Recommendations**



- Provide sustained funding for OL
- Integrate knowledge and perspectives of First Nations and non-Indigenous coastal communities into the co-production of OL knowledge
- Support and promote accessible knowledge and science communication tools
- Create collaborative tools and spaces for OL practice across borders.

### **Advancing the Development of a National Strategy - Intended Outcomes**



- Strengthens Canadians' knowledge & values about the ocean
- Fosters an ethic of care for the ocean in Canadians
- Changes behaviours and incites action
- Influences policy decisions and educates decision-makers
- Advances reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples
- Builds bridges and a culture of collaboration within and beyond the OL community, regionally, nationally, and internationally
