Dear friend,

As I reflect on the rapid growth of Ocean Week Canada, I'm reminded of the centrality of relationships and our unique, yet shared, connections to local waters and the global ocean. Welcome to the Ocean Week Canada 2023 Impact Report. This report serves as a testament to how local ripples, such as knowledge-sharing conversations, shoreline clean-ups, and artist-led creations, contribute to a larger wave of societal engagement across a country as vast, and geographically and culturally diverse, as what we now call Canada.

With the longest coastline of any country, over 2 million lakes, and more than 8500 named rivers, our unique connections with inland waterways, coastal areas, sea ice, and the open ocean are deeply shaped by diverse experiences. Ocean Week Canada provides an annual celebration to share and learn from these different experiences, and together, to engage in collaborative action to ensure a healthy ocean and freshwaters for current and future generations.

Building on the widespread success of the inaugural Ocean Week Canada launched in June 2022, which was extended throughout the summer (exclusive to that year) in the lead up to the Ocean Festival in Vancouver at IMPAC5, Ocean Week Canada 2023 gained significant momentum. This year, we introduced 'regional hubs' in Victoria, Vancouver, Ottawa, Montreal, Halifax, and St John's. These hubs not only facilitated the growth of grassroots participation but also played a crucial role as anchors to the Ocean Week Canada movement. In 2024, we plan to expand further by adding more regional hubs, with a particular emphasis on the northern and prairie provinces. Additionally, we introduced the Community Grants program this year, with over \$60,000 in funding awarded to 28 community-led organizations and events.

By connecting, supporting, and celebrating community and regional events taking place across the country, we create a shared national movement. Together, we are strengthening public understanding of, access to, and participation in freshwater-ocean conservation efforts. Stories and experiences that strengthen our relationship with water- fresh or salty- are essential. Our own health and community well-being, regardless of where we each call home, are dependent on this relationship.

Enjoy the report. Onwards together.





Spotlight on Community Grant-Funded Events

Established in 2023 with funding from Fisheries and Oceans Canada, the Ocean Literacy Community Grants program aims to create accessible and streamlined funding for community-driven ocean literacy initiatives that are regionally, culturally, and linguistically relevant. The first round of funds were distributed to organizations and individuals to host Ocean Week Canada 2023 events.




